**Child Care**

**Ms. Ruby Dhalla (Brampton—Springdale, Lib.):**

Mr. Speaker, the Conservative government has a track record of broken promises, of deception, of cancellation and ripped up contracts. The Atlantic accord, Kyoto, Kelowna were all ripped up. Summer jobs programs were cancelled.
